The Flower Ministry was organized in 1940 under the leadership of the late Rev. Charles H. Hamilton. The idea was brought to the Pastor by Sister Mattie Miller-Young.

The purpose of the Ministry is to provide floral arrangements for the beautification of the sanctuary altar on Sunday mornings. In remembrance of deceased members, the Ministry provides flowers on behalf of the church family for the funeral services. The members of the flower Ministry serves as Flower Bearers during funeral services.

Some of the accomplishments of the ministry are donations to the Transportation Committee for the air conditioners. The ministry contributes to the decorations of the church during the Holiday Season and other special occasions.
